PROGRAM HISTORY

Southwest Human Resource Agency began as Chickasaw Area Development in 1972 and in 1984 became a Human Resource Agency. The Head Start Program began as a summer Head Start Program under Chickasaw Area Development and transitioned into a standard, full year Head Start operating from August to April in 1973. In 1973, the Southwest HRA Head Start program operated nine (9) centers with an enrollment of 320 children. The Southwest HRA Head Start program currently operates 11 centers with an enrollment of 425 children in Chester, Decatur, Hardeman, Hardin, Haywood, Henderson and McNairy Counties.

FEDERAL REVIEW AND AUDIT

During the 2022-2023 program year a Phase 2 onsite review was planned, but did not occur. It is expected that it will occur during the 2023-2024 program year. The purpose of the review is to confirm how we will follow the policies and procedures discussed in Phase 1. SWHRA Head Start was awarded a continuation grant plus COLA and Quality money beginning July 1, 2023. The Annual Audit of the Agency contained no Head Start Findings.
